A.A.A. RULES AS TO PENALTIES.

To be applied by the Referee or Judges when dealing with a winner of a first prize in open handicap as per Rule 35, and shall apply to the mark stated in the programme.

Rule 35. The winner of a first prize in any open handicap event framed to a time standard shall be penalised in all handicap events to which the scale applies, and for which he has made an entry previous to winning last prize, according to the following scale of penalties.

The winner of any such handicap shall carry a penalty in a limited handicap, but the winner of a limited handicap shall not carry under this Rule a penalty in any other than a limited handicap.

No one liable to be penalised shall be entitled or allowed to take part in any competition except from his penalty mark, and everyone so liable to be penalised shall, before taking any part in a competition notify the Referee or Judges, in writing, of any penalty incurred by him.

If a Handicapper has already imposed a penalty, it shall be stated on the Programme, and no further penalty shall apply.

Penalties do not apply to wins on the same day, at the same meeting only.

Penalties must not be enforced beyond the scratch mark, and in all cases an actual scratch man shall be exempt from any penalty.

In the case of a dead heat for first place, each of those who tie shall incur the full penalty for subsequent events unless the dead heat is run off.

In the case of a postponed meeting or competition, winners of first prizes at subsequent meetings or competitions held during the interval must be penalised according to scale unless the handicapper has revised their handicap starts and allowed for their wins.

The Scale of Penalties applies to all open handicaps framed to a time standard, *i.e.* to prizes won in, and entries subsequently made for any such open handicap.

NOTICE TO OFFICIALS.

The Official's Badge (Blue and White) will be the only authority for admission to the green. Officials will please apply for these at the Committee Tent, at 1.45 p.m.

Officials are asked to remember that the public pay to see the finish of the races. The Referee, Judges, and Time-keepers are necessary at the finishing post—all others are requested to remain at their various posts in whatever part of the Ground they may be.

UMPIRES are needed on the bends of the track. Their duty is to report to the Judges any unfairness they observe—whether any protest is made by the competitors concerned or not.

MARKSMEN are required to check the competitors at the marks, and they will be responsible for the draws for positions in every race. Numbered tickets for this purpose will be provided.

COMPETITORS' STEWARDS.—Their duty is to keep all Competitors informed as to the progress of the racing, and see that the Competitors turn out in good time, with their numbers properly affixed.

THE CLERKS OF THE COURSE will be responsible for the green being kept clear of all persons who are not officials, and for the departure from the course of Competitors so soon as their particular race is ended. They will in this duty be assisted by the Stewards, and under no circumstances will any but Officials wearing badges be allowed on the green.
