Your secretary asked for information concerning the Bell and Howell operations that used to be carried out at Mitcheldean. I am sure you will readily appreciate that the majority of the information will undoubtedly be with R.P.I. and Rank Photographic/Rank Audio Visual, however, I have been able to retrieve a certain amount of information which I trust will be of help to you.

If you feel that I could be of assistance in looking through any further data that you get, feel free to call upon me as I still have a pretty good knowledge of what went on between 1948 and 1965.

BRIEF HISTORY.

In 1946 British Acoustic Films and Bell and Howell signed a 15 year manufacturing and marketing agreement covering their photographic products. Bell and Howell retained the dollar markets, B.A.F. the rest of the world. It should of course be noted that the dollar markets represented a rather large percentage of the total world requirement for these types of goods.

16mm Projectors were the first product to be manufactured, and production started rolling in 1948. This was followed by 8mm Cameras and Projectors in 1950 and 16mm Cameras in 1952. There was virtually a continuous build up of production as the figures show.

In 1958 the Rank Organisation divisionalised and it was during the following year that we opened up our own selling Companies in France, Belgium and Germany. Prior to that, all overseas sales had been through agents.

In 1962, the restrictions on Japanese imports were being lifted throughout Europe, we decided to transfer back to Bell and Howell, their rights to manufacture and sell 8mm Cameras and Projectors into our markets, excluding the U.K. which we would retain the some selling rights for.

Because of the growth of the Rank Xerox product, it was decided in 1964 to transfer back to Bell and Howell the manufacture of 16mm Projectors, Rank Audio Visual as it was then known, retaining the selling rights in this country.

During 1965, all Bell and Howell work was completed, equipment transferred to the Bell and Howell Factories in Japan and America. Mitcheldean became part of Rank Xerox approximately July 1st 1966.
