



Challenges ahead for Trustees

Robert Thomas, Chairman of the Trustees, writes:



I'm conscious of the huge debt of gratitude we owe to John Payne and previous Trustee Boards for setting such high standards of management and governance for the Pension Scheme during the course of the past decade and more. What we have done so far this year, and will continue to do, is to build on these strong foundations.

At the March Trustee Board meeting, I set out what I saw as the key challenges that lie ahead for the Trustees over the next year or so, the most important of which are:

- To agree a funding plan with the Company that will lead to the Scheme returning to a 100% funding level.
- To adopt an investment approach known as Liability Driven Investing (LDI) which is designed to improve the management of some of the Scheme's financial risks.

The best advice

Running a pension scheme as large as ours is becoming increasingly complex and it's vital that we have excellent advice in all areas of our operations. With that in mind and following an extensive market review, we have just appointed Sacker and Partners LLP as our legal advisers. Sackers is an independent firm of specialist pension lawyers who focus on advising large pension schemes – they advise more of the UK's top 100 schemes than any other law firm.

In addition, Jeff McMahon will be joining the Xerox Pensions team at the beginning of May in a new role as Head of Pension Investment and Risk. This is a significant appointment and is designed to bring greater focus and expertise to the management of the Scheme's investments.

Trustee Board and Committees

We introduced our committee structures four years ago and, during that time, they have been very successful in improving trustee decision-making. We are now going to review the roles of the Board and Committees to see if further improvements can be made.

Some very significant challenges lie ahead and I will keep you informed of our progress in the months and years to come.

Easier to qualify for Basic State Pension

The Government has announced two pieces of good news on pensions over the past few months:

- *First*, the Basic State Pension has been increased by 2.5% for the current tax year at a time of low inflation.
- *Second*, it is now easier to qualify for a full Basic State Pension. Under the old rules, women needed to have 39 years of National Insurance Contributions and men 44 to qualify for a full pension. Now, for those reaching State Pension Age after 5th April 2010, you need just 30 years to qualify for the full amount, regardless of your gender.

Included with this newsletter is your payslip for May plus your P60 – the detachable document at the bottom of the payslip. It is important to keep your P60 as you may need it when corresponding with HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC).

May is the first pension payment in the new tax year and you may find you have a new tax code. Please check the code – if you think it's incorrect, you should contact HMRC.

Xerox acquires ACS

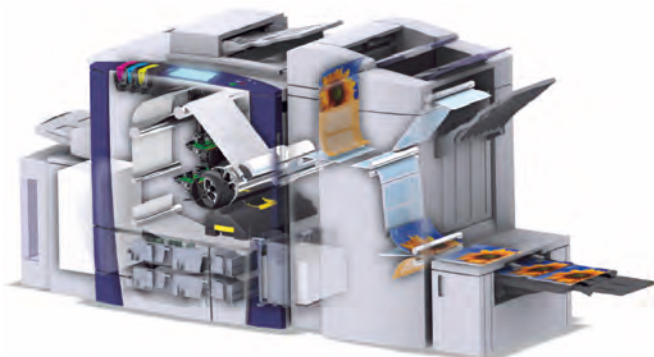
In February, Xerox announced that it had acquired ACS (Affiliated Computer Services) and, overnight, it became the world's leading business process and document management company, with an annual revenue of \$22 billion.

Ursula Burns, Xerox Chief Executive Officer, had this to say about the acquisition of ACS:

"For the past 50 years, Xerox has fortified its leadership in document management, creating new markets through our renowned innovation. With ACS, we take another step forward, expanding our leadership to include business process outsourcing that helps simplify document-driven work. The new Xerox provides the technology and services to help our customers reach new levels of efficiency and effectiveness, giving them the freedom to focus on what matters most: their real business."

Chairman Anne Mulcahy to retire

Anne had this to say:

"Leaving Xerox is not easy, but the time is right. This decision is made infinitely easier by the knowledge that I turn the Company over to a gifted leader at a point when our strategy is sound, our financial position is strong, and our opportunities for growth are considerable."



Anne, aged 57, became Chief Executive Officer of Xerox on 1st August 2001 and Chairman five months later. Before that, she was President and Chief Operating Officer of the Company from May 2000 until July 2001. She began her Xerox career as a sales representative in Boston in 1976. During her 34-year tenure with Xerox, Anne has held senior management positions in sales, human resources and marketing, and led the Xerox business division that sells products for reseller and dealer channels.

Tributes from two senior colleagues

One of her senior colleagues on the Board of Directors, **N.J. Nicholas, Jr.**, had this to say:

"Anne leaves a rich legacy that is defined by her close connection to Xerox customers, her active engagement with Xerox people, and her steadfast commitment to the values of the Company that are inherent in its culture and in her effective leadership. As important, she has worked closely with the Board to ensure a seamless and well-planned leadership succession. She has earned our tremendous respect and our deepest gratitude."

Ursula Burns, who succeeded Anne as Chief Executive Officer last July, made the following comments about Anne:

"A remarkable leader who inspires followership, Anne was instrumental in re-creating our company at a time when we needed it most. She prioritised investments in innovation, shifted our strategy to become more focused on services, and significantly improved our financial health. As a result, we have a strong foundation from which to build an even stronger company. I am grateful for Anne's extraordinary contributions, humbled by her confidence in my leadership, and committed to honouring her impressive legacy."

Life after Xerox

Mitcheldean pensioners safeguard the Royal Prerogative in the Forest of Dean

Bob Turner, Deputy Co-ordinator for West Region, writes:

Xerox pensioners now occupy two of the four places on the Ancient Verderers Court in the Royal Forest of Dean: following a recent election, **Maurice Bent** (left) joined **Ray Wright** (right).



Dating back 800 years, the Forest of Dean Verderers meet quarterly at the Speech House* to discuss the 'Vert and Venison' of the Forest and safeguard the Royal Prerogative and local privileges.

Maurice Bent is a seasoned campaigner and local historian and has written books on his local area and musical traditions in the Dean. He worked in Mitcheldean in parts manufacturing and finished in the early 80s. Ray Wright owns and operates Clearwell Caves one of the major tourist attractions in the Forest of Dean (see story on the right). He worked in Mitcheldean design and drawing office in the late 70s.

Mitcheldean pensioner on Christmas TV

One of the stars of Christmas TV was Mitcheldean pensioner **Peter Symonds**. He starred on **"Oz and Hugh drink to Christmas"** on BBC 2, featuring Oz Clarke and Hugh Dennis.

In the 8-minute sequence, Peter explained the ancient festive custom of "wassailing". So what is "wassailing" that made Peter a TV star?

Wassailing is an old custom that takes place on Old Twelfth Night (17 January, pre 1752 and the adoption in Britain of the Gregorian calendar) or thereabouts, to exhort apple trees to fruit well the following season. 'Wassail' comes from the Anglo-Saxon 'waes hael' meaning "be in good health" (think hale and hearty).

Peter spent 30 years at Mitcheldean, his job mostly involved quality in parts manufacturing and latterly on assemble build.

Clearwell Caves

In 1964, Ray Wright (see photo above in left-hand column) was a founder member of the Rank Xerox Caving Club. He soon realised that most people were oblivious to the hidden world of abandoned iron ore mines beneath the Forest of Dean and so, around 45 years ago, he began work on the idea of a visitor centre at Clearwell.

In 1968, Clearwell Caves opened, with just one cavern accessible to visitors; today there are nine. Ray, now 80, continues to develop his vision for the caves although, his son, Jonathan manages the Caves and is the last Free Miner still mining iron ore and ochre.

The Caves have been used as the backdrop for a plethora of films, including Dr Who whose production team were there recently filming for the first episode of the new series.

Life after Xerox

The art of public speaking

20,000 young people trained in the art of public speaking every year!



Steve Baker, former employee of the UK Company, reports on his life after Xerox:

Since leaving Xerox in 2001, I have been involved with a London-based charitable Foundation which supports young people across London and Essex. Using the skills I acquired from Xerox, I provide the technical support for all their major events, around 110 a year. In 10 years this organisation has given away more than £65 million!

One of their more interesting projects is the world's largest public speaking event for Year 10 children in secondary schools across London and Essex. Every year, almost 20,000 young people are trained for a day in public speaking, at the end of which they deliver a speech to their peers (25) on a subject of their choice in 2-3 minutes, with no notes.

If they are chosen as the winner, they then go on to the Regional / Borough final where they deliver their speech in front of 150 people. Our challenge is to whittle the 37 Regional / Borough finalists down to 18, who then participate in the Grand Final in front of 650 people, including some very notable judges. The BBC programme *'The Speaker'* was based on this project.

Working with these young people gives a true insight into their thoughts, aspirations and dreams; it also keeps me up to date with the youth scene!
