- Instead of receiving a printed copy of XPA News in the autumn each year, news of future events and reports of past events will be found in the XPA section of the website in What's on? and Newsdesk respectively.
- In March each year, using all those email addresses we hold, we'll send a reminder with links for the website. This will give you the latest information on items such as **pension** increases, pay dates and tax changes. (This replaces the annual XPA Update, the last of which was sent to you in March this year.)

You will continue to receive the Annual Report from the Trustees to pensioners, *TimeLine*, which covers a wide variety of information of interest to pensioners. Although *TimeLine* will continue to be offered as a printed document as well as digital for the time being, it is the Company's intention that all communications be delivered via email in the near future.

So, we say *Goodbye* to the old *XPA News* and *Welcome* to a new era of modern XPA communications.

You should confirm approval straightaway to ensure you receive XPA information from your Co-ordinators.

Reporting back on recent events

Peak District walk May 2014

From our excellent base in Buxton we enjoyed some beautiful scenery. The Peak District seems to have cornered the market in squeeze stiles and these were definitely more of a squeeze at the end of the week than at the start ... and that couldn't possibly be down to our good eating.

There were two particular memories: water shooting from the rock under our feet as the River Manifold (which had gone underground some miles upstream) emerged to go on to join the River Dove; and the frighteningly steep descent down into a valley just after lunch on the first day!





Greenwich September 2014

XPA East's last outing in 2014 was to Greenwich. 42 of us had lunch in the William Undercroft of the Old Royal Naval College, after which we split into two groups to be shown around the magnificent buildings and hear about the fascinating history of the site over the last 600 years.

Our tour included a surprise stop at a memorial of a young French sailor who had set off to try to find and rescue William Franklin who was lost together with 128 men exploring the North-West Passage. We had had a good day – some went home and others climbed the hill to the Royal Observatory to look back down on Greenwich.

Guided tour of Knebworth House July 2014

The quality of the guides that we have for these events makes our visits so enjoyable and valuable. Our guides at Knebworth were no exception, giving us great insight to the house and its past occupants.

The Lytton family have owned Knebworth House for five centuries and in that time it has changed shape and passed through various stages of disrepair and renovation. Knebworth is now famous as a venue for rock and pop concerts but has also been used for many films including *The King's Speech, Batman, The Shooting Party* and *Harry Potter*.





Shuttleworth Collection guided tour August 2014

With our excellent guide, we learned that this is a collection and *not* a museum as the planes still fly. Shuttleworth itself has a dozen flying days each year and they provide aircraft to support flying days elsewhere. We saw the plane that held the record for flying from England to South Africa and back (a record that stood until recently), the oldest Tiger Moth, replicas used in "Those Magnificent men in their Flying Machines" and so much more.

After a good lunch we were guided around the Swiss Garden which was in magnificent condition following a major make-over with help from the Heritage Lottery Fund.

Walk from Lewes to Brighton June 2014

Having enjoyed a good lunch at The Juggs pub in Kingston near Lewes, we trekked up a steep path on to the South Downs. This was the Juggs Road, a pre-18th century track that had been used to transport fish by donkey from Brighton to the market in Lewes. After taking in great views over the Downs, we headed across Brighton Racecourse to reach Brighton Marina. Here we cheated a little ... catching the Volks Railway along the seafront for one and a quarter miles to Brighton's remaining pier. Opened in 1883 by Magnus Volk, the Volks Railway was the first public electric railway in the world.

Many XPA members have already been fortunate enough to visit the facilities and enjoy the 80-seat, state-of-the-art auditorium, the Discovery Area and the café.






Xerox Managed Print Services in "top position worldwide"
