A Xerox employee conquers the Alp d'Huez.

Last year there was an announcement in the local newspaper "De Gelderlander" recruiting its readers to participate, together with Hennie Kuiper (winner of Paris-Roubaix and the toughest lap in the Tour de France, the Alpe d'Huez), to cycle up the Alp d'Huez. Along with 417 other cyclists ranging from beginners to experienced amateurs, I also responded to this announcement.

To be able to climb this famous mountain (approx. 14 KM in distance, 8% incline, 21 curves and at 1800m high) you must be well prepared. Four planned training sessions were provided to get our bodies fit and of course a whole lot of my own spare time as well, however accompanied by the nice spring sunshine, it wasn't really punishment at all.

D-Day was 16th of May 2006. 12 buses left for France to arrive the next day in heavy rainfall. The die-hard enthusiasts decided to do a trial run that day whilst the others decided to try the local pubs, the question in everybody's minds being, "how would the weather be the next day?"

Fortunately enough, it was beautiful and under a warm sun 22 groups consisting of 20 cyclists left in one minute intervals. The first part is a very steep climb, and the some people dismounted and walked their bikes up the hill. If you see the sight of a long stretch of people on their bikes ahead of you, some people seem to get wings and by saying that it seemed like I flew up the mountain and finished within 1 hour, 5 minutes and 8 seconds, which was the 34th spot. This is extremely good for

my motivation and it encouraged me to climb the Calibrier (2650m high, 34km long) the next day.

The last few kilometres ended in the snow, a mighty and spectacular sight and as you see in the photo, an all time Xerox high.
