

## Mitcheldean Parish Council Minutes - December 2001 – March 2003 extracts

**20 December 2001** – page 2415

### History of Xerox in Mitcheldean

The Chairman [A R Pickthall] informed the Meeting that Xerox has offered the Parish Council the first copier (a 660) produced at Mitcheldean together with other items of interest (photographs etc)

Councillors agreed that it was an excellent gesture by the Local Manager and will arrange to display the items on the ground floor of the Town Hall

### History of Xerox at Mitcheldean

A letter has been received from the Group Resources Manager at Xerox stating that they are willing, in principle, to donate some of their earlier equipment and that other memorabilia for display at the Town Hall – once they are no longer required by Xerox.

Councillors agreed that estimates should be obtained to upgrade the ground floor area for the display.

### Museum Project

The Chairman [A R Pickthall] reported that the curtains from the ground floor of the Town Hall had disintegrated whilst being washed by a cleaning company 0 "Rub-a-Dub-Dub". It was agreed that quotations should be obtained from at least firms for supplying and fitting blinds.
